Subject: Objections / Suggestions with respect to provision for storage of Food Grains items in Godowns on agricultural land adjoining G.T. Karnal Road. under D.D.A Zonal Plan P-1 & P-2

Sir,

Regarding the above captioned matter, We furnish our objections / suggestion on behalf of our members, based on the following facts & grounds as under.

1. That our godowns for storage of essential commodities (Agricultural produce) like Wheat, Rice, Pulses, etc. are more than 30 years old and constructed by our members on their own land spreading on more than 1000 Acres land (approximate.)
2. That out of total requirement of food for a population of near about 2 crores of Delhi, only 2% i.e 56000 M. Ton (Rice and Wheat only) every year is distributed through PDS by Delhi Govt. Copy of letter from Commissioner Food and Civil supplies Delhi is enclosed herewith as Annexure -A The rest 98% of population is being provided with Food Grains by the private sector through these godowns. These are thus lifeline for the population of NCT of Delhi

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3. That, to maintain smooth and uninterrupted food supply we need approx . 400 Hectares of land for storage of these essential commodities at buffer stock level for a period, of at least, four months.

4. That as per our discussion with then Hon'ble U.D. Minister Shri Jai Pal Reddy, it was agreed by Hon'ble Minister that provision of storage of these essential commodities miserably escaped attention of the U.D. Ministry while preparing MPD-2021.

5. That on the recommendations of the Monitoring committee, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its order dated 08.10.2007 (at page No. 9 copy attached) has permitted the storage of agricultural produce like rice, wheat and pulses in the godowns in rural areas, So that the agricultural produces can be stoked in such godown (Annexure-B)

6. That at the time of sealing of these food gains godowns . in 2007, Hon'ble L.G. were kind enough to direct and to allow the storing of Food Grains in the agriculture land as an essential activity Annexre -C.

7. We humbly bring to your kind notice that para 10.3 page 16-17 of zonal plan Narela P-1 provides for total land measuring 397.81 hectares which has been earmarked for I.F.C which includes District Centres, wholesale and service market, informal bazaar, communities centre and LSS/CSC, But, no provision has been made for these said godowns for storage of these essential commodities. We fail to understand how the existing godowns sepread over 400.

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Hectates would be relocated in the said zonal plan P-1 & P-2 without identifying the land. So proper care requires to be taken while finalizing the Master Plan-2021 otherwise it may lead to scarcity of these essential commodities by hampering supply line, resulting into hike in prices of these commodities affecting a major poor segment of population of NCT Delhi region, creating chaos outcry in general public.

8. Sir, as recently observed by Hon'ble supreme court of India and also by Hon'ble Food and civil Supply Minister Shri K.V. Thomas (attached Photocopy of statement), there is already acute/huge shortage of warehouses for storage of such Food Grains (Essential commodities) in India, in our view particularly in NCT Delhi. as there being no sufficient provision for storage of food Grains items in MPD-2021.

9. That It is very surprising to note that warehouses / Godowns in K-1 zone in Mundka, Nangloi, Rohtak Road, mostly meant for storage of Timber & PVC and PVC waste etc., have been brought under redevelopment/regularization.(Photocopy of zonal plan K-1 attach.) Whereas our Warehouses meant for storage of Food Grains items (**Essential Commodities**) have not yet been brought under the scheme of regularization / redevelopment under zonal plan P-1 & P-2 (concern zone) despite our personal visits/ efforts to UD Ministry & DDA office. In our view, It is very important, keeping in view the prevailing Acute scarcity of Godowns, at present our nation is facing, for storage of Food Grains items, This facts has been confirmed by our Hon'ble apex court and Hon'ble Food & Supply Minister of India, as stated in preceding para.

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4:

So keeping in view the above facts, we request you to make sufficient provisions / amendment for regularizing the existing said godwns in P-1 & P-2 Zones in Narela. or arrange for replacement of the same in a phase wise manner, if it has to be done.

So, once again it is humbly brought to your kind notice that while finalizing the MPD-2021 the above facts should be kept in mind. for making amendment for regularization above said godowns.

These commodities (Rice & Wheat) allocation received from G.O.I. on annual basis (2007-08) and sugar on monthly basis. The department has allocated SFAs to zones per month on the basis of Card position reported by Zonal Offices in the format of DR-IV-V. It is added here that Food & Supplies Department gives 25 kg. of Wheat and 10 kg. of Rice per card to approximately 7.87 lakhs cardholders of BPL category and to APL cardholders living in Slum and Resettlement Colonies. Approximately 20.38 lakhs APL cardholders are distributed 8 Kg. of wheat & 6 Kg. of rice.

Learned Amicus Curiae shall also indicate his views by a memorandum. The views of the Monitoring Committee shall also be placed on record, in addition to the views expressed in the Report dated 05.10.2007, i.e. in Report

It is pointed out by the Monitoring Committee in its report that the conversion charges have not been paid for registration as small shops or for carrying out commercial activities. Learned counsel for the MCD shall find out the actual position and file an affidavit.

So far as functioning of NGOs in residential buildings is concerned, the Monitoring Committee has given its report with reference to a letter of the DDA dated 27th August, 2007. Since the matter needs to have the attention of the MCD and the DDA, let the extracts of Report No. 43 of the Monitoring Committee (paragraphs 14 and 15) be supplied to learned counsel for the MCD and DDA so that their response can be brought on record within three weeks. Call the matter after three weeks.

We have considered the recommendations of the Monitoring Committee, as contained in paragraph-16. The

storage of agricultural produce like rice, wheat and pulses in the godowns in rural areas shall be permitted so that the agricultural produces can be stocked in such godowns.

Issue notice to Raj Vidya Kender, Village Chakrapur along with extracts of Report No. 43 (paragraph-17) of the Monitoring Committee's Report to show cause as to why action in terms of the recommendations shall not be taken.

Issue notice also to the National Capital Territory of Delhi to file its response. The response shall

A delegation of Delhi Wholesale Grain Merchants met the Hon'ble L.G. today regarding sealing of their godowns on the directions of the Monitoring Committee, which are constructed on the agriculture land.

They have submitted that cleaning, processing and storing of grains is a part of agricultural activity and the same may be allowed in the agriculture land. To term such storing of agricultural produce in the agriculture land as utilizing the land for non-agricultural activities and sealing thereof is wrong and unfair. In fact in all the countries world over agricultural produces are processed and stored in shos which are built in the agriculture land and the same should also be allowed in Delhi. They have requested that their store houses, which have been sealed should be de-sealed immediately.

After discussing the matter with the Wholesale Grain Dealers, Commr./MCD and others, Hon'ble L.G. directed that



- (a) Storing of wheat, rice and other agricultural produces in the agriculture land is an essential activity and, therefore, should be allowed.
 - (b) The above views of the Government should be put forth to the Monitoring Committee, who should be requested to de-seal the godowns and allow storage facilities in the agriculture land.
 - (c) Agricultural activities i.e. storing of grains in the agriculture land, MCD/Divisional Commr. must file a review petition before the Hon'ble High Court, through Addl. Solicitor General or any other eminent lawyer.

A representation signed by the President of Delhi Grain Merchants Association has been received. The main points raised in the representation are as follows:

- 1) Godowns for storage of essential commodities (agriculture produce) like wheat, rice, pulses etc. have been constructed over the last 30 years on private land spreading over more than 1000 acres in Narela. This land falling under the acquisition process of the P-1 Narela Phase-III Project. About 90% of the land of these godowns are falling under the proposed acquisition.
- 2) Supply through PDS is only 2% of the Delhi's requirement and remaining 98% is being provided by the private sector through these godowns. Therefore, removal of these godowns will seriously jeopardize the supply of foodgrains in Delhi.
- 3) Hon'ble Supreme Court has permitted the storage of agricultural produce, like rice, wheat and pulses in the godowns in rural areas.
- 4) Hon'ble Lt. Governor has also permitted the storage of foodgrains in agriculture land as an essential activity.

Keeping the above points in view, they have requested to exclude the existing godowns from the proposed acquisition. I would request you to consider their proposal sympathetically.

2.6 Industry:

In Delhi, High Tech and value added industries which are not labour intensive are to be located. In the zone 144 ha of land is proposed under the industrial use in between Rohtak Railway Line and Rohtak Road. Sawaran Park having cluster of industries more than 70% which is already notified by Govt. of Delhi, has been indicated as part of industrial area. Besides this Naresh Park having an area about 5 ha. has also been included as industrial area as per notification of Delhi Govt. About 26 ha land on South of Rohtak Road in Revenue village Mundka added as Industrial Use as per notification of GNCTD C.1/Policy/INSTU/Phirni road/Mundka Udyog/2007/20 dated 17.9.2007. Other 150 ha area is to be planned as part of Facility Corridor.

Within this pocket of industrial land use falling in between Rohtak Road & Rohtak Railway line, in an area of about 30 ha built-up structures (pucca / semi-pucca / purely temporary) in scattered form under Warehousing/ Industrial use exists the same has been shown in existing built-up area for which redevelopment plan shall be prepared, the same land is proposed to be developed/ redeveloped for industrial use by DSIDC. The delineation of the built-up area & its boundary under industrial pockets shall be taken up while preparing the redevelopment plans / industrial area plans.

2.7 Trade & Commerce, wholesale market:

Wholesale Market: In this entire sub zone K-I, there is hardly any planned commercial market. Existing wholesale trade / warehousing of PVC wastes, timber trade are the predominant activities located on both sides of Rohtak Road near Mundka Village which shall be upgraded or redeveloped for wholesale trade of Timber/Timber products, building material such as Iron/ Hardware and related activities or other commodities. The area of both the market is about 50 ha. About 27 ha. area is falling

within the industrial use already notified in MPD – 2021 which shall require modification in the Master Plan for Delhi – 2021 from Industrial to Commercial. About 23 ha land in the south of Rohtak Road just opposite to the 27 ha pocket has been put in Warehousing area (built-up): For both the pockets redevelopment plans shall be prepared.

Local Commercial Markets are along the major roads i.e. Rohtak road, Najafgarh- Nangloi road.

As per the notification of Delhi Government/MCD, roads/streets which as Mixed Land Use or Commercial shall be detailed out in scheme / layout / redevelopment plan.

Commercial area: In the zone Commercial Area has been proposed in facility corridor along the 100 m road or along 45 m road or Najafgarh – Nangloi Road of 36 Mtr R/w. Wholesale Market, IT Park, etc are to be detailed out while preparing layout plan/scheme of the area.

The hierarchy of commerce center/activities shall be taken up. Commercial activities in the form of District Center, Community Center, Local Shopping Center and Convenient shopping center shall be as per the MPD-2021. Three district centres, 12 community centers, 120 Local shopping centers and 600 convenience shopping centers has been estimated for this population within planned area / Redevelopment area of unauthorised colonies.

Service Market: The service market and organized informal bazaars has also to be planned at an appropriate location. Service markets shall be provided while working out the details of the commercial pockets indicated in the zonal plan.

Informal Sector: The informal sector markets/shops shall also be provided at appropriate location to cater the needs of the proposed population.
