SUGGESTIONS FOR MASTER PLAN OF DELHI

I have following suggestion to make.

1. The future conflicts between states of India, between nations of South Asia will revolve around water management. There are already water disputes between Delhi and other neighboring states. Exploitation of under ground water has reached alarming levels. The water from neighboring states by way of canals is being contested by all states. Yamuna River is badly polluted and the water is unfit for washing/gardens not to talk of drinking. We need to take steps to conserve water.
2. The plan envisages laying of golf courses in Delhi specially in North and West Delhi.
3. A golf course requires approximation 125 acres of fertile land. A course is guzzler of water, pesticide and fertilizer. The water used is, generally, sub soil which has already been over exploited. This needs to be stopped/altered.
4. I have come across a web site which suggests a modified version of Golf. The site is 'golf21century.com.
5. The author envisages laying a golf course in 35 acres of land. This course will utilize 25% less water, fertilizer and pesticide. This will be suitable for Delhi. We can carry out a study of the popularity and utilization of golf courses.
6. A golf course of 125 acres is utilized by 450 persons on s holiday/Sunday. It is used by about 150 persons on a week day and that too in early hours of morning and late hours of evening. For the benefit of limited "rich" people we can not earmark such large resources. Like the author of the web site remarks "A Golf Course of 125 cares is utilized by 125 rich people with the help of 125 school drop outs (caddies)".
7. A wastage by any standards.
8. Another suggestion I have is...Stop use of all water pumps exploiting sub-soil water. Only tube wells installed by Govt should be allowed to function.
9. Third, In all new projects make it obligatory to lay separate water pipes for drinking water and separate for garden/washing purposes.
10. A large sum be earmarked and time bound projects implemented to stop flow of drains in to Yamuna River
