### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### Participation Related (Already answered)

# > Is the Competition only for graduate and postgraduate students of Architecture or Landscape Architecture?

No. Any bonafide student who is currently pursuing their respective graduate or undergraduate degrees/diplomas in Architecture, Landscape Architecture or any other related fields can participate in the Competition.

# > Is there any entry fee for the Competition?

No.

#### **Deliverables Related**

# > Do we have to submit the design statement and cover page along with the design sheets?

Yes. Each of the deliverables has to be sent both in hard copies (in sizes and format mentioned in the Competition brief with the Team ID's).and soft copies (in CD's/USB drive in format prescribed with the Team ID's)

# > What shall be the size of the cover page?

The size of the cover page shall be A1 (841 x 594mm) sheet, in English, landscape format for the hard copy and for the soft copy as mentioned in the 'Deliverables' section of the Competition brief.

#### > Can we send the submission via email?

No. The mode of the submission of entries shall be by Courier, Speed Post or by-hand to the Office of Additional Commissioner (Landscape), 11th floor, Vikas Minar, ITO, New Delhi as mentioned in the Competition brief in the 'Deliverables' section.

# > Can the entry be hand drawn or is it necessary to use a software?

Yes. But the basic layout plan and drawings need to be in AutoCAD format. Hand-drawn sketches and renderings can be additional to depict the design.

**Design Related** 

- > What is the extent to which the existing design can be changed?
- > Do we need to consider the whole site for designing /landscape?
- > Is there any limit to the number of kiosks that are to be proposed?
- Do we need to consider the existing food stalls and integrate them to the design or can they be removed? Can new entries and pathways be proposed?
- Is uprooting of trees allowed?

Interventions that are absolutely necessary for the proposed design are acceptable. The existing site features in the vicinity of the proposed location can be integrated with the proposal. The Master Plan norms need to be followed in the design. All the existing trees should be retained.
